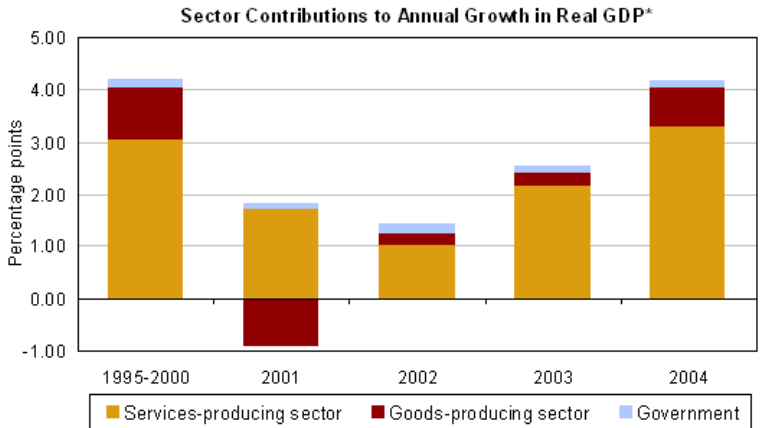
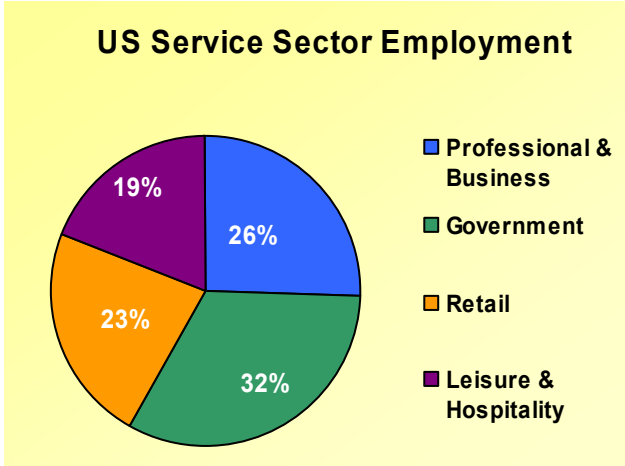


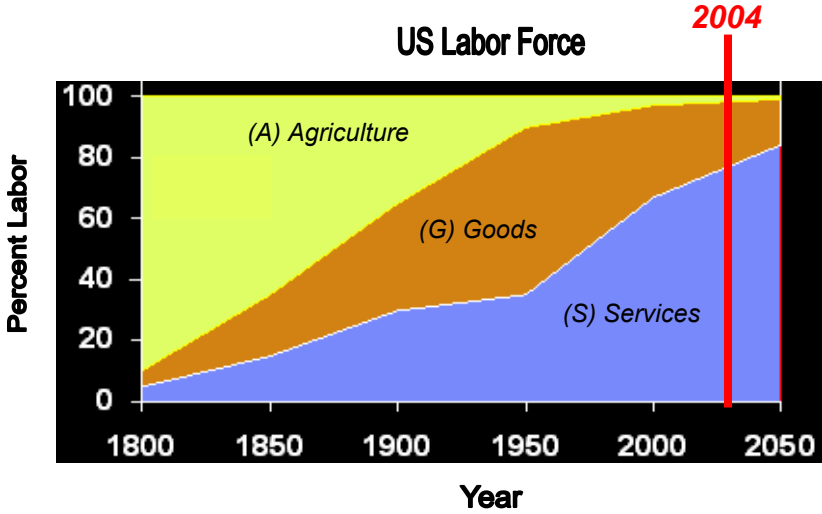
The U.S. Service Economy

Service Sector Innovation Includes:

The Service sector generated 80% of economic growth in 2004 (latest figure).
The US has maintained a services trade surplus since 1971. That surplus grew by \$8.5 billion in 2005 to \$56.3 billion.
